Apply between January 13th -February 21st, 2025. The NASA DEVELOP program is a paid 10-week research opportunity open to current students and recent graduates. Applicants must be able to commit to 20-29 hours. The month of January is usually a period of critical blood shortages. It takes 1,000 blood donors every day to keep our hospitals operational across the Pacific Northwest, and 1 in 7 people entering a hospital will need blood.
