Race Monologues is a platform where Lewis & Clark College students share original stories about their racial and ethnic identity. Since 2002, these narratives have covered experiences like joy and pain, solidarity

The voices highlighted in Race Monologues primarily belong to students of color, whose perspectives have often been marginalised at the predominantly white institution. The event gives students an opportunity to be heard in ways they felt were overlooked by administrators and peers. Each story is deeply personal, offering insight into the complexities of racial and ethnic identity in today's world.
