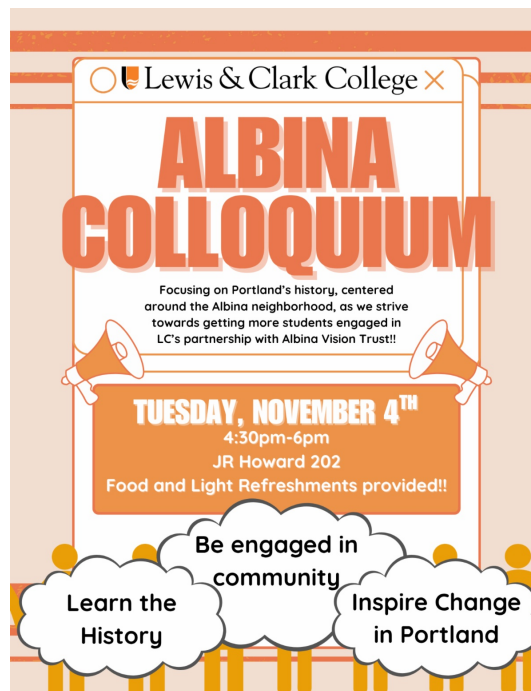

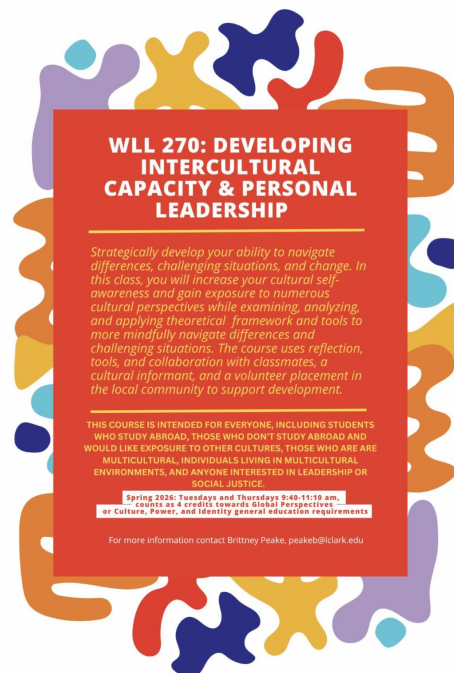
Upcoming Community Meeting
