




Spring Course: WLL 270 Developing Intercultural Capacity and Personal Leadership

Are you interested in developing your personal leadership skills? Enroll in WLL 270: Developing Intercultural Capacity and Personal Leadership this spring. The course focuses on strengthening your ability to connect across diverse perspectives while enhancing communication and personal growth. It also fulfills the Global Perspectives or Culture, Power, and Identity general education requirements.



WLL 270: DEVELOPING INTERCULTURAL CAPACITY & PERSONAL LEADERSHIP

Strategically develop your ability to navigate differences, challenging situations, and change. In this class, you will increase your cultural self-awareness and gain exposure to numerous cultural perspectives while examining, analyzing, and applying theoretical framework and tools to more mindfully navigate differences and challenging situations. The course uses reflection, tools, and collaboration with classmates, a cultural informant, and a volunteer placement in the local community to support development.

THIS COURSE IS INTENDED FOR EVERYONE, INCLUDING STUDENTS WHO STUDY ABROAD, THOSE WHO DON'T STUDY ABROAD AND WOULD LIKE EXPOSURE TO OTHER CULTURES, THOSE WHO ARE MULTICULTURAL, INDIVIDUALS LIVING IN MULTICULTURAL ENVIRONMENTS, AND ANYONE INTERESTED IN LEADERSHIP OR SOCIAL JUSTICE.

Spring 2026: Tuesdays and Thursdays 9:45-11:10 am. Counts as 4 credits towards Global Perspectives, or Culture, Power, and Identity general education requirements.
