November is Indigenous Peoples' Heritage Month!

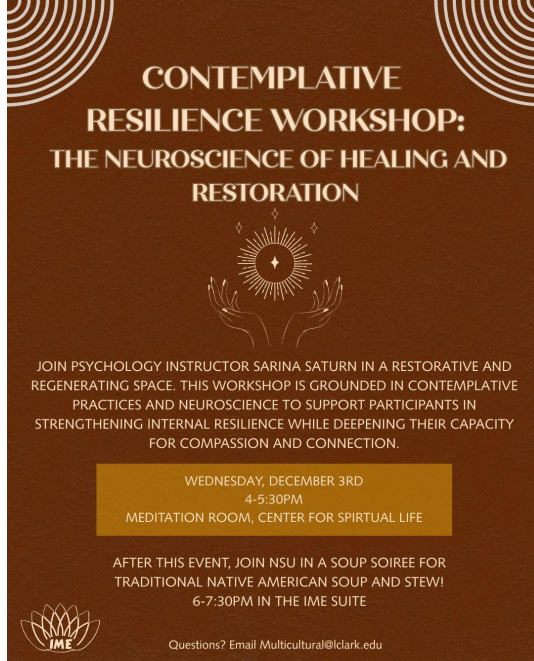

Join Psychology instructor, Sarina Saturn in a restorative and regenerating space! We will be practicing mindfulness and



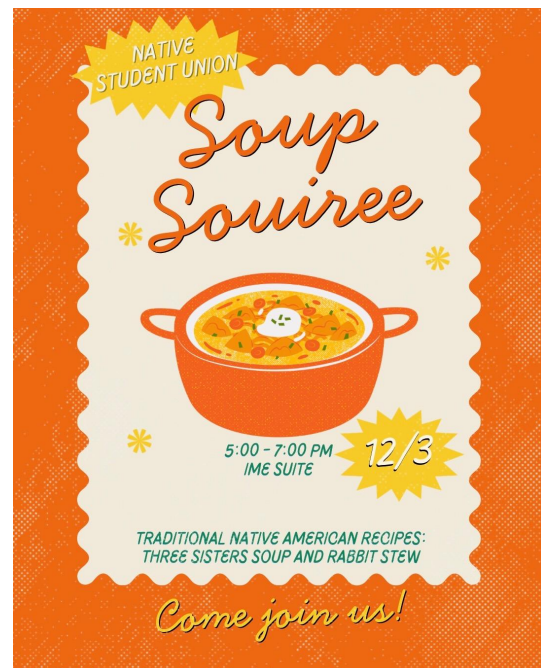
meditation in order to strengthen our internal resilience. We will have self-care items for folks to take with them post-event.

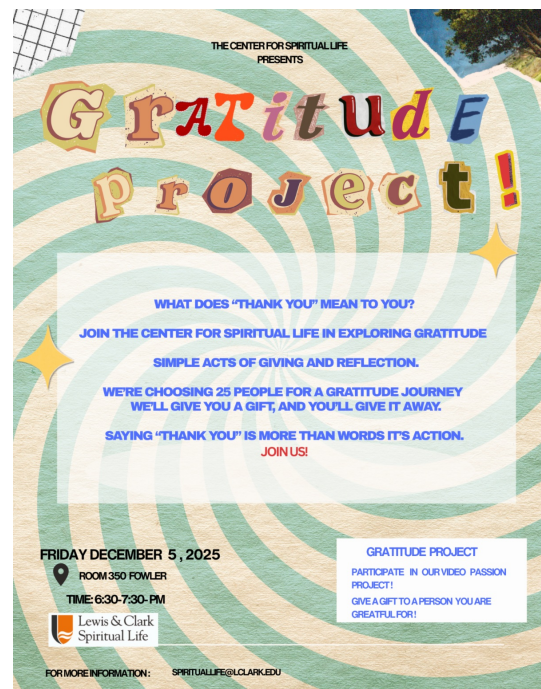

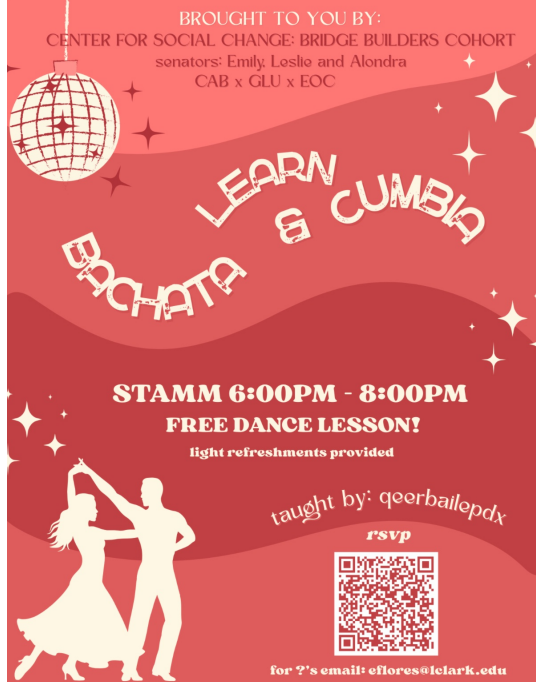
